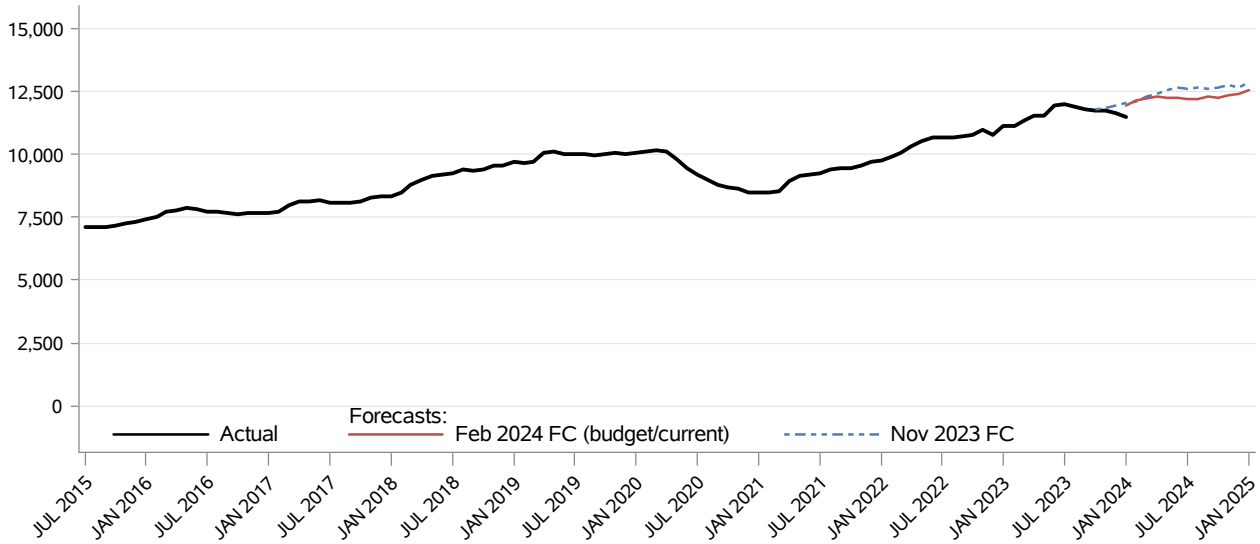


Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) Early Support for Infant and Toddlers (ESIT) CFC Monthly Monitoring Report
