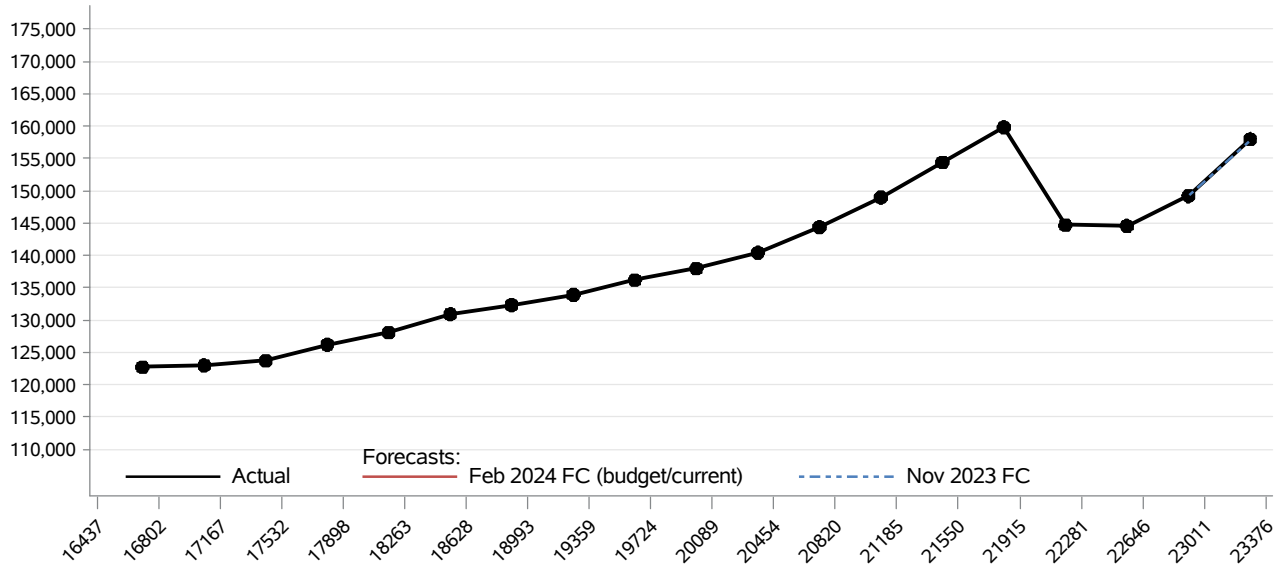


## Public Education Special Education

CFC Monthly Monitoring Report

The **The Common School Special** forecast consists of two programs: a separately funded Age 3-Pre-Kindergarten program, and the Age K-21 school-based Special Education program, indexed to a percentage of each school district's total full-time equivalent enrollment. Up until the 2020-21 school year, Special Education also included the Age 0-2 Infant and Toddler program.

Descriptions:

- **Actual:** October headcount enrollment in the Special Education program.
- **Budget Forecast:** Caseload forecast adopted by the Caseload Forecast Council to serve as the basis for the biennial or supplemental budget. The actual budget may incorporate adjustments to this forecast to reflect legislation and policy decisions by the legislature subsequent to the development of the forecast.
- **Current Forecast:** Most recent forecast adopted by the Caseload Forecast Council; may be the same as the Budget Forecast.

**Special Notes:**

The chart and tables present the October Enrollment, while the official caseload forecast is the 'annual average.' The October enrollment is used here because it allows the display of the current year before the annual average is available and because the October enrollment is used to forecast future school years. The October enrollment will differ from the annual average, but is typically a good proxy for the final annual average.
