
Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) College Bound Scholarship Program

CFC Monthly Monitoring Report

The **College Bound Scholarship Program** (CBSP) is a state-funded scholarship program administered by the Washington Student Achievement Council (WSAC) (formally the Higher Education Coordinating Board (HECB). The program establishes a contractual commitment to provide four years of tuition (at public institution rates) and book allowances to lower income students who sign up in the 7th or 8th grade, graduate high school with a 'C' or better average, avoid a felony conviction and successfully apply to a higher education institution when they graduate. The CBSP forecast is the annual average count of eligible CBSP students enrolled in eligible institutions.
